E.02. Balanced Teams

Having 2 or more teams in an age division tier must be balanced. Teams deemed unbalanced will be removed from the schedule until balanced.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

E.02. Balanced Teams

Having 2 or more teams in an age division tier do not need to be balanced.

Rationale for this motion:

So much time and effort is put into balancing and worrying about re-balancing teams at tiering break. Association division managers, coaches, executives having to explain to commissioners why a team is or isn't balanced takes hours of valuable volunteer time. Adjusting this policy would eliminate all of this time.

This proposal would provide a team for the medium-sized clubs to play in the Tier 2 division, and for those smaller clubs whose Tier 1 teams don't quite fit in Tier 1, yet don't have any competition in Tier 2.

The unbalanced Tier 2 teams would provide a team in a 3rd Tier following tiering break for smaller clubs whose Tier 2 teams struggle in the Tier 2 division.

We spend hours of volunteer time recruiting players. Putting these new to lacrosse players on team with players who are skilled and experienced, and most likely the last cuts from Tier 1, is intimidating for the newcomers, and detrimental to retention of those players.

New to lacrosse players are often ignored during game play on a Tier 2 team. and barely see the ball. If the clubs who have 2 teams in a Tier could place those players in a position to excel by having

unbalanced teams, it would be much better for retention of the players who we spent so much time recruiting.

F.01. Playing Season

The playing season may start as early as the first (1st) weekend after Labour Day and may continue as late as the final week-end in March of the following year. All PCFLL scheduled and rescheduled games between the start of the season and the following five (5) scheduled week-ends will be considered Tiering games, which count towards league play. The following weekend will be a tiering break. The Regular fall season begins the weekend following the last Tiering break and continues until mid-December. A winter break will run from mid-December until early January of the following year. The regular winter season begins in early January and may continue until the final week-end in March.

At the start of the playing season the PCFLL Executive will place teams in the appropriate tiers best suited to each team's level of play. Clubs may request in writing any changes to their teams starting tier prior to the creation of the fall and winter schedule. The PCFLL Executive will review any requests and place teams in the tier best suited to each team's level of play.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

F.01. Playing Season

The playing season may start as early as the first (1st) weekend after Labour Day and may continue as late as the final week-end in March of the following year. All PCFLL scheduled and rescheduled games between the start of the season and the following five (5) scheduled week-ends will be considered Tiering games, which count towards league play. The following weekend will be a tiering break. The Regular fall season begins the weekend following the last Tiering break and continues until mid-December. A winter break will run from mid-December until early January of the following year. The regular winter season begins in early January and may continue until the final week-end in March. *The Winter Season shall be a continuation of the fall season. All teams will continue to play each other, regardless of provincial declarations, with every effort made to have a balanced schedule.*

At the start of the playing season the PCFLL Executive will place teams in the appropriate tiers best suited to each team's level of play. Clubs may request in writing any changes to their teams starting tier prior to the creation of the fall and winter schedule. The PCFLL Executive will review any requests and place teams in the tier best suited to each team's level of play.

Rationale for this motion:

For several years, and without policy support, the league has chosen to modify the winter schedule so that teams that have declared for Provincials only play each other and teams that have not declared only play each other. This has resulted in multiple teams having bye week-ends or imbalanced schedules where some teams face more challenging games than other teams strictly on when they are

played. This motion, if passed, will allow for more teams to have games in the Winter schedule and will go further to ensure a balanced schedule throughout the entire season.

League play points shall be determined as follows:

- c) The offending team shall be fined \$100.00 (or \$200.00 if less than 24 hours' notice of forfeiture) and the non-offending team shall be awarded cost associated with the game (i.e. referee fees, field cost) when a team defaults a game by failing to appear for the scheduled game.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

F.03. Points

League play points shall be determined as follows:

- c) *The offending team shall be fined \$100.00 if the offending team cancels a game within 96 hours of the scheduled start time (or \$200.00 if less than 24 hours' notice of forfeiture) – payable to the PCFLL. The non-offending team shall be awarded 2 points. Costs associated with the game (i.e. referee fees, field cost) will be paid by the offending team. The game expenses will be paid to the non-offending association/club within thirty (30) days of the receipts received.*

Points League play points shall be determined as follows:

- e) Any team found guilty of playing an unregistered player during a regularly scheduled game (league, tournament, exhibition and provincial) shall forfeit all games won during which said player was a participant. The home association will be fined \$250 (payable to the PCFLL) if a player has played is found to be unregistered, defined as registered in the BCLA player database and all required, completed registration forms in the hands of the League Registrar (prior to Oct 31 deadline) or BCLA Registrar.

To add the fine amount and provide further clarification on types of games (per BCLA Op Policy 13.07 b)

Rationale for this motion:

This would ensure that teams play at a level for a minimum amount of time before attending Provincials at that level. It should allow for a reasonable assessment as to whether they belong at their newly assigned level.

L.01. League Fees

The league fees per team will be set at the AGM each year (currently set at twenty dollars (\$20.00)) and must be paid on or before a date determined by the PCFLL Executive. Only teams who have paid by this date will be scheduled for league play starting the same calendar year. The team shall submit no less than ten (10) dates for home games along with their league fees.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

L.01. League Fees

- a) The league fees per team will be set at the AGM each year (currently set at twenty dollars (\$20.00)) and must be paid on or before a date determined by the PCFLL Executive. Only teams who have paid by this date will be scheduled for league play starting the same calendar year. The team shall submit no less than ten (10) dates for home games along with their league fees.

b) Each association submits a cheque for \$530, for each team they are declaring, at the September declaration meeting. The cheque would be for the 10-player minimum, at \$51/player, plus the \$20/team amount.

Rationale for this motion:

It would help to bring fees in sooner rather than waiting for the actual registration numbers in October. This would help us pay the BCLA in a timely manner.

In accordance with Youth Field Operating Policy 13 and the Woman's Field Operating Policy Reg. 36, player registration forms and required fees must be submitted to the Registrar on or before the Wednesday after the BCLA AGM (October) of the playing season or earlier date as determined by the PCFLL Executive. Late registration will be closed on November 30th of the playing season or other date as determined by the PCFLL Executive.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

M.01. Team/Player Registration

In accordance with Youth Field Operating Policy 13 and the Woman's Field Operating Policy Reg. 36, player registration forms and required fees must be submitted to the BCLA Registrar on or before *October 31st of each playing year (Sept-Aug)*. Late registration will be closed on November 30 other date as determined by the PCFLL Executive.

M.02. Fines for Late Submission

Each association will submit to the BCLA Office, on or before 4:00 pm of the Wednesday following

the BCLA AGM (October) of each playing year, a team list generated from the on-line database. If an association does not comply with said dates they will be fined \$250.00, and another \$250.00 for each additional seven-day period that the team lists are not received.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

M.02. Fines for Late Submission

Each association will submit to the BCLA Office, *by October 31st, a team list generated from the on-line database. Also, each association is to have the balance of their registration fees submitted by October 31st to the PCFLL Treasurer (adjustments may be necessary after the BCLA Registrar has verified registration numbers). If an association does not comply with said dates, they will be fined \$250.00, and another \$250.00 for each additional seven-day period that the team lists and/or registration fees are not received.*

Rationale for this motion:

Registration is no longer dealt with at the league level. Registration fees must be submitted in a time that will allow the PCFLL to remit funds to the BCLA in a timely manner, and not have to dip into their reserves.

If no playoff format is required, then the final league standings will be used to determine the declared PCFLL teams eligible for the Field Provincials.
- b) Tie breaker rule should standing be tied after the regular season
 1. Highest winning percentage
 2. if tied, then most wins
 3. if tied, then most ties
 4. if tied, then fewest games played
 5. if tied, then Least Goals Against
 6. if tied, then Coin Toss

The amended regulation reads as follows:

O.02. Play-off Schedule

- a) The PCFLL Executive, if required, will determine a playoff format after the Field Directorate has declared the number of PCFLL teams eligible for the Field Provincial Championships. If no playoff format is required, then the final league standings will be used to determine the declared PCFLL teams eligible for the Field Provincials.
- b) *The Winter Schedule would be a form of play-off schedule. Only teams that have declared for Provincials will be scheduled against each other. Teams that have not declared will be scheduled against each other whenever possible.*

- c) Tie breaker rule should standing be tied after the regular season
1. Highest winning percentage
 2. if tied, then most wins
 3. if tied, then most ties
 4. if tied, then fewest games played
 5. if tied, then Least Goals Against
 6. if tied, then Coin Toss

Rationale for this motion:

Only teams that have declared should play each other in the Winter Schedule. Playing an undeclared team could skew the final standings and unfairly eliminate a team from qualifying for Provincials. The regulations will have to be re-numbered.

Score Sheets It is the responsibility of the home team to ensure that the game sheet is clearly and properly filled out prior to the start of each home game. Game sheets must be protected from the weather to ensure they are legible. Improper game sheets will be considered invalid for league results and player eligibility for the Provincial Championships. The home team's scorekeeper is responsible for distributing the copies of the game sheet at the end of a game. The winning team's representative is given the top 2 copies of the game sheet (white and yellow). The losing team's representative is given the bottom copy of the game sheet (pink). In the event of a tie, the home team's representative is given the top 2 copies of the game sheet. The winning team's coach or manager is responsible for submitting the original game sheet (top white copy) to the League Commissioner. A copy of the game sheet must be faxed or electronically sent to the League Commissioner within 24 hours after the conclusion of the respective game. The original game sheet must be mailed out to the League Commissioner within 3 days of the conclusion of the respective game. In the event of a tie, the home team's coach or manager is responsible for submitting the original game sheet. All players can be added to the game sheet at the beginning of the game, but any player who hasn't arrived by halftime must be removed from the game sheet roster. All penalties must be clearly added to the scoresheet.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

P.03. Score Sheets It is the responsibility of the home team to ensure that the game sheet is clearly and properly filled out prior to the start of each home game. Game sheets must be protected from the weather to ensure they are legible. Improper game sheets will be considered invalid for league results and player eligibility for the Provincial Championships. The home team's scorekeeper is responsible for distributing the copies of the game sheet at the end of a game. The winning team's representative is given the *white and pink copies*. The losing team's representative is given the *yellow copy*. In the event of a tie, the home team's representative is given the *white and pink copy*. The winning team's coach or manager is responsible for submitting the original game sheet (top white copy) to the League Commissioner. A copy of the game sheet must be electronically sent to the League Commissioner within 24 hours after the conclusion of the respective game. The original game sheet must be mailed out to the

League Commissioner within 3 days of the conclusion of the respective game. In the event of a tie, the home team's coach or manager is responsible for submitting the original game sheet. All players can be added to the game sheet at the beginning of the game, but any player who hasn't arrived by halftime must be removed from the game sheet roster. All penalties must be clearly added to the scoresheet.

P.05. Youth Game Length

Games will consist of the following, which may vary in each division, with a mandatory stop time during the last 3 minutes of the last quarter if the game is within 5 goals and should field time permit.

- a) U7 games - two 20-minute halves
- b) U9 games – 12-minute quarters (min.) or as time and field conditions permit.
- c) U11 games – 5- minute quarters (min.) or as time and field conditions permit.
- d) U13 games – 15-minute quarters (min.) or as time and field conditions permit.
- e) U15 games – 15-minute quarters (min.) or as time and field conditions permit.
- f) U18 games – 15-minute quarters (minimum) or as time and field conditions permit.

Regular scheduled games will start no later than 15 minutes after scheduled game time, when the field is available for play. If a team does not field the minimum (10) players, the game will be deemed a forfeit. For U7 and U9, the minimum number of players is eight (8). The length of the quarters can be altered if both coaches agree.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

P.05. Youth Game Length

Games will consist of the following, which may vary in each division, with stop time in the last **30 seconds of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quarters. When the clock is on, the field stop time begins regardless of the score. The last two (2) minutes of the 4th quarter will be stop time if the score is within 5 goals. The score when there are 2 minutes left dictates if the time remaining is stop time or running time. If the score is 5 goals or less, the last 2 minutes of the 4th quarter is stop time. If the score is greater than 5 goals, the last 2 minutes of the 4th quarter is running time. Whatever the decision is at the 2-minute mark of the 4th quarter will continue until the end of the game. There is not changing from running time to stop time or vice-versa.**

- a) U7 games - two 20-minute halves
- b) U9 games – 12-minute quarters (min.) or as time and field conditions permit.
- c) U11 games – 5- minute quarters (min.) or as time and field conditions permit.
- d) U13 games – 15-minute quarters (min.) or as time and field conditions permit.
- e) U15 games – 15-minute quarters (min.) or as time and field conditions permit.
- f) U18 games – 15-minute quarters (minimum) or as time and field conditions permit.

Regular scheduled games will start no later than 15 minutes after scheduled game time, when the field is available for play. If a team does not field the minimum (10) players, the game will be deemed a forfeit. For U7 and U9, the minimum number of players is eight (8). The length of the quarters can be altered if both coaches agree.

Rationale for this motion:

Housekeeping – in line with what we are already doing and clarifying the rules regarding stop time in the 4th quarter.

Officials are to be paid prior to the start of games unless other arrangements have been made beforehand.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

Q.04. Payment of Officials

Both teams shall be responsible for payment of the officials. They shall each be responsible for payment of one game fee and payment will be made in cash prior to the start of the game. pg. 16 Game fees are those set by BCLA Operating Policy OR those recommended by the League. Officials are to be paid prior to the start of games unless other arrangements have been made beforehand. *If the officials have been assigned by a league authority and they are entitled to compensate for travel then the PCFLL will be responsible for travel fees.*

If the game is not played, then they will only receive payment from the home team. Officials will still receive payment if team(s) does not show up for game.

Rationale for this motion:

The league has taken responsibility for assigning U13, U15, and U18. It should therefore be the responsibility of the league to bear the cost of travel as they take the responsibility of finding the referees.

Q.04. Payment of Officials

Game fees are those set by BCLA Operating Policy OR those recommended by the League. Officials are to be paid prior to the start of games unless other arrangements have been made beforehand.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

- a) Both teams shall be responsible for payment of the officials. They shall each be responsible for payment of one game fee and payment will be made in cash prior to the start of the game.
- b) Game fees are those set by BCLA Operating Policy OR those recommended by the League.
- c) Referees who travel an additional 40 km or more from their home address to the designated game field are entitled to a \$10 compensation.*
 - i) This fee is payable only once per day per club regardless of number of games officiated at same field.*
 - ii) Referee allocator will advise teams prior to game day if travel fees will apply*
- d) If the game is not played, then they will only receive payment from the home team. Officials will still receive payment if team(s) does not show up for game.

Rationale for this motion:

There is a confusion throughout the league on how travel fees apply and who pays them. Chilliwack paid \$170.00 in travel fees this season yet our refs were not paid travel fees when they were assigned games in other cities like Maple Ridge

Teams are to ensure they are at the field early and ready for equipment check prior to the start time.

The amended regulation reads as follows:

CC.01. Game duration

- U8 – 2 X 12-minute halves with a 2-minute break
- U12 - 4 x 12-minute quarters
- U15 & U19 – 4 x 15-minute quarters

All games are to be played under the BCLA “Fair Play Code of Conduct”, meaning that all players should get equal playing time.

U12, U15 & U19

- 2 minutes between 1st and 2nd Quarter & 3rd and 4th Quarter
- 5 minutes at half time (between 2nd & 3rd quarter) o Last 30 seconds of 1st, 2nd & 3rd quarter will be stop time
